An application is required for on-campus transfers. Since there is a limit on the number of students who may be admitted, applicants with the greatest chance of admission will have a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher. A minimum of 124 credits and a 2.0 GPA is required for graduation. 40 credits must be in general studies outside the major.

### FOOTNOTES

1. COMARTS 100 & L SC COM 100 will fulfill both the GER Com A and HDFS Speech Communication requirements simultaneously.
2. Some GER Com B courses (COMARTS 266, PSYCH 225) will also fulfill another requirement in this major.
3. Some GER Quan B courses (PSYCH 210, SOC 359, SOC 360, STAT 301) will also fulfill another requirement in this major.
4. HDFS 474, HDFS 478, or HDFS 521 will simultaneously fulfill both the Ethnic Studies requirement and another requirement in the major.
